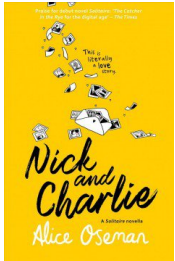

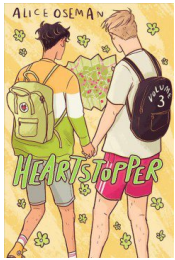

Nick & Charlie is based on the beloved characters from the graphic novel *Heartstopper*.

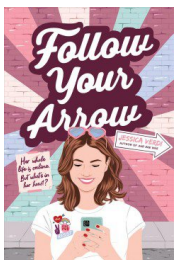

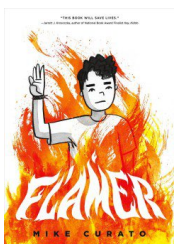
out when to tell their friends that they're dating.

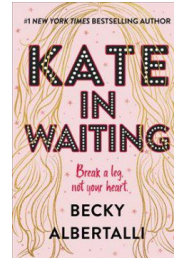

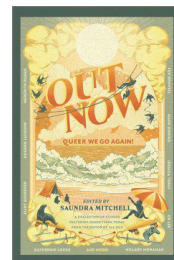

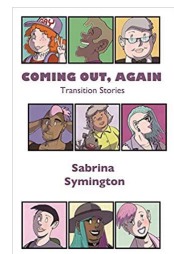

A witty and empowering graphic novel following members of a diverse queer community as they navigate life outside the mainstream.

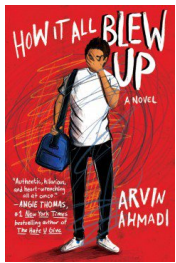


Date me, Bryson Keller

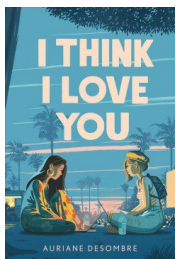


How it all blew up

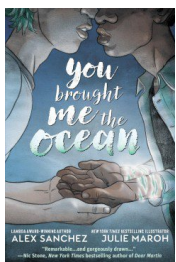

blue markings on his skin giving him a glow when he touches water.

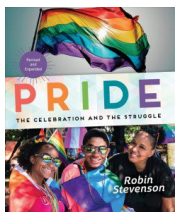


The magic fish

have the right words because his parents are struggling with their English. Is there a Vietnamese word for what he's going through? Is there a way to tell them he's gay?

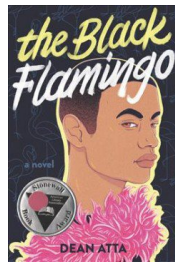


Pride : the celebration and the struggle

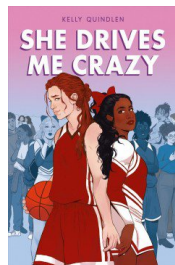


The black flamingo

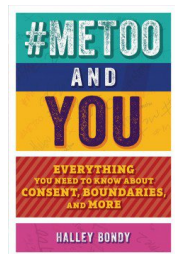

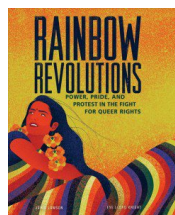


#MeToo and you : everything you need to know about consent, boundaries, and more

emotionally abusive situations. Tween readers will learn about consent, harassment, abuse, and healthy boundaries in all types of relationships.

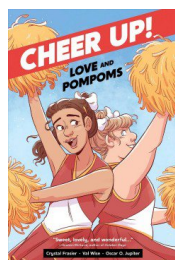


Rainbow revolutions : power, pride, and protest in the fight for queer rights
